# Waller William Gunkel

May 2, 1921 March 17, 2015

Waller William Gunkel 93 of Eustis passed away on March 17, 2015. He was born in Chicago, Illinois and -moved to Eustis from Michigan in 1981. He was a retired aeronautical engineer having worked for General Motors for 32 years. Waller was a Veteran having served in the United

States Army Air Corp during WWII, as a pilot of the Martin Marauder B26 with the 323<sup>rd</sup> Bomber Group in the 454<sup>th</sup> Bomb Squadron and he completed 72 missions. A member of the First Presbyterian Church of Eustis and an active volunteer and guide at the Trout Lake Nature Center of Eustis. He is survived by his wife Jean; they were married for 72 years. Also surviving are his children; Ronald William (Joyce) Gunkel of Jacksonville, Florida, Susan (Gary) Kruchten of Broad Run, Virginia and Paul Steven (Barbara Bravos) Gunkel of Sacramento, California, three grandchildren and five great grandchildren. Memorial services will be held in the First Presbyterian Church of Eustis at 2 PM Sunday with Dr. Leon Bloder Officiating.

# **Spring 2015**

70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary



This year marks the 70<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of WWII. By the time you receive this newsletter most of the VE day, Victory in Europe celebrations will already have happened. Some of our Veterans and family members participated in these events.

This June Michael Graham is on his way to Earls Colne. He is going to meet with our friend John Camp from the Boxted Air museum. Michael is the son of Capt. Harold Gram Jr. who was a pilot with the 454<sup>th</sup>

Squadron. John will give Michael a tour of the Boxted Air Museum as well as show him some of the sights around Earls Colne.

July 10<sup>th</sup> thru the 23<sup>rd</sup>, Nathan Kline from the 454<sup>th</sup> Squadron, in conjunction with Specially Tours, is sponsoring a European Battlefield tour. Stops will include Churchill's WWII Bunker in London, The Flying Legends Air Show in Duxford, Utah and Omaha Beaches, Bastogne, Hitler's Eagle Nest in the Bavarian Alps plus other locations. Carleton Rehr wife of Louis Rehr from the 456<sup>th</sup> Squadron was in Samoussy, France for the 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of VE Day. Samoussy is where A-69 the 323<sup>rd</sup> BG airbase at Laon-Athies was located. Carleton and Louis were instrumental in helping to place a monument there dedicated to the 323rd BG and all the men who died for the liberation of France. She was asked to say a few words.

Louis Rehr was 456<sup>th</sup> Squadron CO from February to July 1945. He along with Carleton are the authors of the book "Marauder – Memoir of a B-26 Pilot in Europe in World War II". Louis passed in October of 2011 and was buried at Arlington National

#### <u>Flak Bait</u>



Work on the restoration of Flak Bait continues at the National Air and Space Museum in Washington D.C. All of her parts are being examined at the Mary Baker Engen Restoration Hangar. Flak Bait completed 207 combat missions while flying with the 322<sup>nd</sup> Bomb Group, 449<sup>th</sup> Squadron. This is more than any other Allied combat aircraft. The only other aircraft to have completed more combat missions was a De Havilland Mosquito which completed 213 missions. Unfortunately

this aircraft was destroyed in a crash at Calgary, Canada two days after V-E Day

# 323rd BG Documentary Film



We are close to wrapping up the 323<sup>rd</sup> BG documentary that we have been working on for the last several years. With any luck it should be done in time for this year's fall reunion.

After Lars Anderson from Victory Films had pulled all the 323<sup>rd</sup> BG film clips from the US National Archives he found that there wasn't a lot of film footage from the time the group was based in

France at A-69, Laon-Athies. So a search was made to find as many good quality still

pictures from the archives of the National Museum of the USAF and the U.S. National Archives. Additionally Marjorie Spradling and her daughter Nancy were kind enough to allow us to copy the color slides that her husband George took during WWII. George was a pilot with the 454<sup>th</sup> Squadron and completed 63 combat missions. Some of you may already have seen a few of these fantastic color pictures in Roger Freeman's book "The Ninth Air Force in Colour". These color pictures are an exceptional record of the 323<sup>rd</sup> BG in action and an outstanding addition to our documentary. Thank you, Marjorie and Nancy.

Martin B-26 Marauder



There is a new B-26 book which recently came out on the market by William Wolf. It's called "Martin B-26 Marauder the Ultimate Look: From Drawing Board to Widow Maker Vindicated". The ISBN number is 978-0-7643-4741-2. It runs about \$56 and is available at Amazon.com as well as other sources.

This comprehensive B-26 book is not for the faint of heart. It contains 640 pages with over 900 photos and drawings plus 20 color profiles. Drawing on knowledge from the MHS archives, Akron archives, NMUSAF archives and personal papers of Peyton Magruder it is everything you wanted to know inside and out about the building of the Martin B-26 Marauder from its first inception to its production. The emphasis of this book is

the plane itself rather than the combat missions it flew.

This is the 5<sup>th</sup> volume in a series of William Wolf's ultimate look at the AAF bomber. A word of advice to you, if you intend to purchase a copy of this book do it sooner than later. His books tend to sell out fast and there usually isn't a second printing.


American Air Museum in Britian

Marauder Men



Without a doubt one of the most comprehensive books ever written covering the history of the 323<sup>rd</sup> BG was John Moench's book "Marauder Men – An Account of the Martin B-26 Marauder". It covers all the missions the 323<sup>rd</sup> BG flew during WWII and is loaded with details and pictures. Many of these pictures came from the personal albums of our Veterans which added greatly in the telling of our history. When second or third generations write to me enquiring about their fathers, grandfathers or uncles, this is usually the first book I recommend that they try to purchase. The book is currently out of print and there are no future printings planned.

Recently I have started to see copies of John's book starting to pop up more and more on e-bay. I would

like to offer a suggestion. If you come across a copy of "Marauder Men" that someone in the family purchased and no longer wants might I suggest you consider donating it to the 454<sup>th</sup> Squadron Association? This would be a win – win situation! We could resell it to Veterans family member who was looking for a copy of John's book at a reasonable price. The proceeds of the sale would then go to fund future projects to improve the data base and archives of the 323<sup>rd</sup> BG for future generations.

There are also two other excellent books on the 323<sup>rd</sup> BG. They are "Marauder a Memoir of a B-26 Pilot in Europe in World War II" that I had mentioned earlier in this newsletter by Louis and Carleton Rehr ISBN 0-7864-1664-5 and "Strikes 323<sup>rd</sup> Bomb Group in World War II" by Ross E. Harlan ISBN 0-9766-463-2-3. Both books are currently available through Amazon.com.
